3. Bicycle Routes for the future
  - a. Heba El-Guendy shared the maps of the proposed neighborhood routes.
    - i. There will be directional signs to destinations like schools, trains, etc. with route numbers
    - ii. Routes will not be striped or affect residential parking
    - iii. Are to encourage recreational and destination riding
    - iv. Do not replace the plans for striping busier street that commuter biking will use
    - v. Project was paid for by grants
  
4. Street Maintenance
  - a. Tony Pineda led an informal Q & A
    - i. Street maintenance has been reduced by half from what it used to be due to budget constraints
    - ii. Resurfacing used to be every ~5-7 years is now ~10-15 years

- iii. Pothole repair will still be done quickly! Call public works at 730-7510 for the answering point for pothole and needed street repairs
- iv. Other initiatives like NEAT through Neighborhood Preservation can also be called for help with sidewalk issues. Message center is 730-7610

5. Striping for Bike Lanes

a. Heba El – Guendy and Tony Pineda

- i. The bike lanes will continue per the 2006 plan, and will be at a slower rate because of the economic issues. One of the big issues is budgeting for ongoing maintenance.
- ii. Decisions about bike lanes are made by the analysis of the intersections. Largely the capacity for left turn lanes for car traffic. Ratings must be at least a “D” on a scale that runs from A to E, where “E” is unacceptable.
- iii. Where ever there is to be a change in the road stripes, i.e., from two lanes in each direction to one lane in each direction with a central turn lane and bicycle lanes. There is always community consultation in several media—meetings, letters, surveys, etc., particularly concerning any issues with street parking.
- iv. The plan for the Mary St bike lanes is already posted on the web. Because of the legal action taken on the bridge, that part of the project will be separated from the rest so it does not hold up the rest of the plan.
